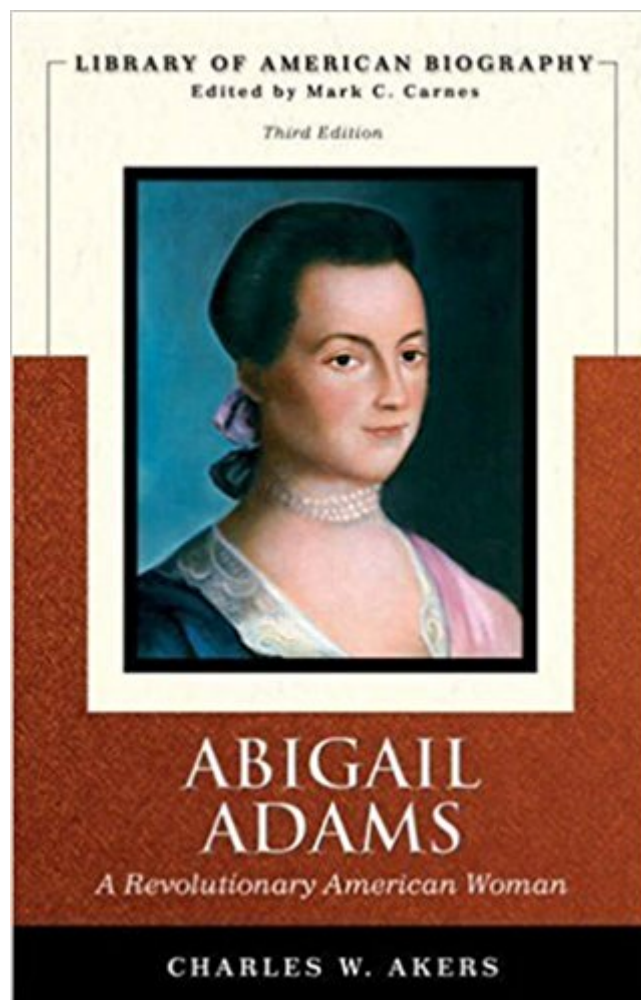




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Abigail Adams: A Revolutionary American Woman (Library Of American Biography Series) (3rd Edition)
