


The book was found

Inertia, force, mass, gravity, velocity, acceleration . . . cause and effect. Liz Emerson doesn’t understand any of it. But I do. I understand how we fall. Where we fall. Why we fall. I understand her sadness and loneliness and silence, her shattered heart. It doesn’t have to be this way, does it? It wasn’t always this way, was it? Stay alive, Liz Emerson, stay alive.

A book that leaves you thinking long after the binding cracks closed. Superficial appearances are not what they seem, and the most popular, athletic girl may actually be the one most likely to fall in an attempt to fly. Newton’s Third Law states that for every action there is always an equal and opposite reaction, and bullying others finally pushes Liz under. Amy Zhang is a literary writer and captures the high school scene with ease and truth. Her first book is more than a success; it brings issues to the forefront and will hopefully help others deal with similar problems before it’s too late. Her writing made me think deeply about my own life—how I treat others and why impatience and intolerance is more prominent in relationships than love and acceptance. A necessary read for all teens and adults, and although it’s emotional and thought provoking, it’s humorous and entertaining and a book that won’t stay unopened on a bookshelf for long.

I don’t know what I was expecting when I bought this book; it just wasn’t that. Liz is one of the most complex, interesting characters I’ve ever read. She hates herself and the world; and no longer sees anything beautiful in it. So, she kills herself. Or at least tries to because she ends up in a hospital bed clinging to life. It tells how she tore down everyone close to her, how she was a total and utter

bitch to all her friends, ect. People turned Liz into something she couldn't undo. Because they built her up to be a bitch/popular, that's all she ever was. What's really interesting is the point of view its in. We rarely hear from the bully/top bitch. Its a nice change and honestly, I liked Liz. Even with all her flaws and how rude she was. There was something so raw and childlike about her. Liz lashed out on everyone because she was scared and felt unloved. I can see myself in her, everyone will be able to see themselves in her. Liz is a breath of fresh air because she is every teen struggling with depression.

I loved this book. The characters were remarkably well-developed and relatable. The topics addressed (substance abuse, slut-shaming, abortion, mental illness) were harrowing and even tragic, but never embellished or glamorized. They were presented to the reader honestly and unfiltered, creating a heartbreakingly realistic portrayal of teen life. While the YA world is chock-full of fantasy and other "escapist" reads, it's refreshing to get the occasional well-crafted dose of gritty reality. The beauty of a story like *Falling Into Place* is in its ability to voice and validate the struggles that teens face and help them realize that they are not alone. Highly recommended!

I'm writing this review almost a year after the fact, so I can attest that this one really stays with you. It's raw and urgent with real insight into teen cliques, cruelty, and despair. definitely a shining star of YA lit.
