

Overall, this book lists most of the sought after varieties for that particular year. Unfortunately, it does not list every error. I think a small chart with in the back of the book with all recognized varieties on it would be more helpful than some of the charts, like a cross reference between each company that recognizes the error. Thats on the main pages, so why do it in the back and repeat

yourself. The book is spiral bound. I think it will last quite a while, as my son and I use these on a regular basis and have not had any page issues so far. The books take a beating and are holding up. I used to collect error, damaged and variety coins back in the 1970's and this book is a welcome change. The only CON is the pricing. I have read a few comments on the web about the pricing of coins is NOT correct in Volume I and II. Apparently there was an issue with the person who was in charge of making the price changes. They used a template on most pages and either quit or left the company before finishing the price updates. Some of the pricing is WAY low. There is NO WAY you're going to be able to find a coin at the prices suggested in most cases. Once that is corrected in future Volumes, this book will be hard to beat.

I just gave my hard copy to my grandson, and found out I could save on the Kindle version. I was skeptical about resolution, readability, etc., but there are absolutely no problems with the Kindle edition on my 8" Kindle. For the book itself, I love it. It's amazing how much treasure there is in loose change from common dates. I've already found (and sold) hundreds of dollars worth of error coins, thanks to this book. Whether particularly interested in coin collecting, or just "making" some extra money, this certain pays for itself with just a moderate amount of effort.

This is the very first book in my start to coin collecting and I can say 100% that I have not been disappointed. I have learned so much from it and have not been bored or confused at all. The hints and tips are very helpful, the taste of history that is included is very helpful, and the up close photos truly help me to understand what I'm looking for. The way the book is arranged make my searches easier and allow me to locate and understand everything with no problem. I actually find myself reading the book and not just referencing-it makes me want to learn more than just the specific item I was looking up. I highly recommend volume 1 and 2 as the beginning to anyone starting out.

"Buy the book before you buy the coin" is some of the best advice often given by coin experts. This is one of those books to buy, in addition to Vol. II. Don't spend that pocket change before you do. In addition to both Cherry Pickers' Guides, for someone, like myself, who collects U.S. coins, I recommend having a current copy of The Official Red Book; The Official Guide to Coin Grading and Counterfeit Detection; PhotoGrade and/or The Official American Numismatics Association Grading Standards of United States Coins; and The Coin Collector's Survival Manual, all of which can be purchased on .com. When it comes to coin collecting, ignorance isn't just an excuse, it can be downright costly.

This book was a nice guide to use as I search through coin rolls and pocket change as a beginner. I think I would probably buy the physical book though next time.

A useful book with quality materials. It is well written and full of wonderful information. I am not crazy about how the pages stick to the spiral binding, but I guess that will improve with time. In other words, it is a bit hard to turn the pages. I do, however, appreciate that the spiral is hidden by the binding. I now have Volume I and Volume II of the 5th edition, and they look nice on the shelf together.

I choose this rating because it is a great read and I understand what it says also it is very helpful

My main interest is in Buffalo and Jefferson nickels. To be aware of recognized varieties within these sets one must have this book. It's not unusual for varieties that have been included in Cherrypickers to later be recognized in the Red Book. It's advantageous to know what's in Cherrypickers before they make it to Red Book status. For this purpose, this book is a must.
