I Am A Church Member: Discovering The Attitude That Makes The Difference



Synopsis

Best-selling author and ministry leader Thom S. Rainer drew an exceptional response when he posted a 500-word declaration about church membership to his daily blog. "I Am a Church Member" started a conversation about the attitudes and responsibilities of church members -- rather than the functional and theological issues -- that previous new member primers all but ignored. Thoughtfully expanded to book form, *I Am a Church Member* begins to remedy the outbreak of inactive or barely committed church members, addressing without apology what is expected of those who join a body of believers. When a person's attitude is consistently biblical and healthy, matters of giving, serving, and so forth will fall into place more naturally. Six intentional chapters with study questions guide this rising discussion: 1. I Will Be a Unifying Church Member 2. I Will Not Let the Church Be About My Preferences and Desires 3. I Will Pray for My Church Leaders 4. I Will Lead My Family to Be Healthy Church Members 5. I Will Be a Functioning Member 6. I Will Treasure Church Membership as a Gift

Thom S. Rainer is the president and CEO of LifeWay Christian Resources, one of the largest Christian resource companies in the world. Rainer has put together an excellent prescription for the sickness of selfish thing that has invaded the Christian church in the last thirty years. The book is short yet back with challenging thinking. Each of the six commitments should be made by every member of every church. If that happened a lot of what ails the church and keeps it from being Christ's witness in the world would go away. Great questions and covenants at the end of each chapter. Our church will be including it in our orientation for new members. The one drawback is the chapter on Pastors and church leaders. There are very few pastors that run into the situation of constant overwork that Rainer describes. Most churches have more than one staff member now to look after some of what he attributes to a single pastor or churchs have developed procedures to ensure they have proper time to themselves.. There are times when a Pastor may find himself harried with a number of colliding demands on his time, but rarely on an ongoing basis and, in these days this is not different that the average working person. While Rainer does mention praying for other church leaders they are given only passing mention. Many lay leaders work full time and then put in a lot of additional time to volunteering in various church activities. This needed as much recognition as the Pastor. I would like to have used this book as a church-wide small group study, but this chapter was my reason not to. I felt it would be demeaning to hard working lay people and create controversy over the role of the pastor in our church where the pastor recently left. On the whole though it is a book every church attender should read and consider.

Six simple chapters accurately diagnose the problem at hand. Church isn't about me. But in an effort to get me to serve my neighbor I'm led to think that if church is centered on serving you everything will work well. In fact church is about Christ and his sacrifice. Only being rooted in the love of Christ can I love my brothers and sisters. The pledges are good things to strive for but not a silver bullet--even if all got on board.

Thom Rainer in his book, I Am a Church Member, provides his audience with a clear, applicable commentary on how we, as church members, can better understand, appreciate, and enjoy our time in the church. Perhaps the first point that should be made is that this book's main audience is the new, disconnected, or frustrated Christian. Rainer repeatedly shares about people who come into the church, get excited, become more involved but ultimately see the flaws in the church. What Rainer offers is that we have two choices. We can either accept the flaws of the men and women we serve with, or we can focus on these flaws and because of this drive ourselves out of the church. This is not to say that we as Christians don't all (regardless of or time or position in the church) need to here this message. We all experience frustration and burnout; however, the thrust of Rainer's purpose is how to get the disenfranchised Christian to understand what it really means to be a member of the church. This book would prove extraordinarily useful in a home study, membership class, or small group study. What makes it most pertinent to these types of studies are the structure, the review, and the pledge. The book is broken into six, manageable sections that could easily be shared and discussed in under an hour. At the end of these sections are review questions. These questions help not only with discussion of a group, but also with the reflection of an individual. Finally, each section ends with a pledge. Not unlike the Pledge of Allegiance that we recited in school, these pledges are there for each person to reflect on our personal responsibility and accountability to something greater: our commitment to God, the church, and to each other. This book does a great job talking through what it means to be a member in any Christian church. I love how he talked through the scripture and then also has discussion questions so the reader can really make sure that what was explained has sunk in. I also really appreciate the commitments that the reader is asked to sign. This is not just information, but also practical applications for our

everyday lives. The only critique I have is referring to the pastor only as "he". I assume only men are allowed to be pastors in Mr. Rainer's tradition, but I would think a simple edit to include women who are pastors would be doable.

This relatively short book is tightly written, engagingly direct, and biblically accurate. Rainer directly addresses the the difficulties that contemporary churches face concerning people who are not committed to the church. After an introduction which specifically shows the need for this book, he divides his discussion into six pertinent chapters: (1) I will be a functioning church member; (2) I will be a unifying church member; (3) I will not let my church be about my preferences and desires; (4) I will pray for my church leaders; (5) I will lead my family to be healthy church members; and (6) I will treasure my church membership as a gift. In each chapter he sets forth the rationale for his discussion, the relevance of his observations, and the biblical data which support his assertions. This is a book which all church leaders and members should read.
