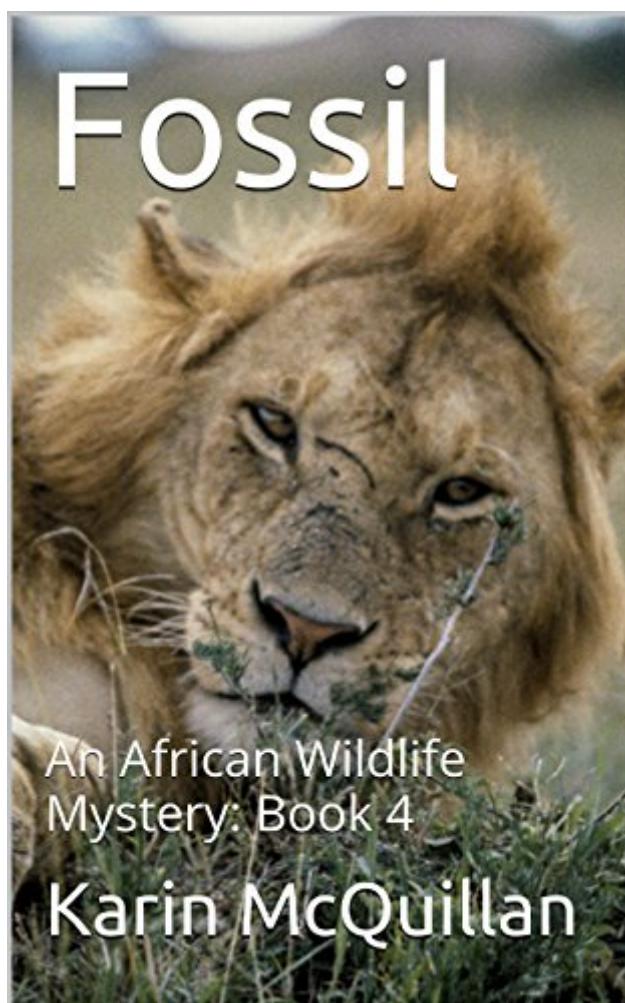


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Fossil: Murder In The Serengeti (An African Wildlife Mystery Book 4)



Synopsis

Fossil is the fourth fast-paced African mystery in the Jazz Jasper series. This time we journey to Tanzania, to the world famous Olduvai Gorge, where the Leakeys discovered the missing link between apes and men. An all-star team of international scientists has uncovered a hominid skull which will shed light on the big question of human nature: was it killing or cooperation that was the driving force behind human evolution? Explosive rivalries--personal, professional and racial-- are tearing the archeological team apart. Human predatory behavior intrudes into the natural order. One of the Tanzanian paleontologists is murdered and the fossil stolen. An innocent camp servant is arrested for the crime, plunging Jazz and Omondi into the search for the real killer. Their pursuit of clues leads them through dramatic African adventures of the sort readers have come to expect from previous Jazz Jasper mysteries. Clues, plot twists and African adventures are integrated into a realistic world of wildlife brought to life in vivid detail. For readers who have enjoyed the wild animals in previous books, Fossil will focus on the predators--lions, leopards, wild dogs and hyenas--who gather in the Serengeti to feast during one of the great animal spectacles on earth, the mass migration.

Overall, I think this is the best book in the series so far. There's quite a lot of interesting information about fossil-hunting, local tribal customs, and wild animal behavior, all of it delivered painlessly as part of the story-line. There's more character development than the previous books have had, which is always welcome. (I'm one of those readers who's more interested in the characters than in the actual plot.) I couldn't decide whether to check "some sexual content," or "explicit sexual content" because it's borderline--the author went into more detail than in the other three books in the series. It was also, in my opinion, unnecessary, although I wasn't offended by it. It certainly didn't further the plot. The plot itself was well-thought-out and had several unexpected twists and turns, all of which had been well set-up to be believable when they occurred. As always in books of this type, there's a number of characters who could be the murderer and it keeps you guessing very nicely. It's a "good read," and I'm looking forward to the next book.
