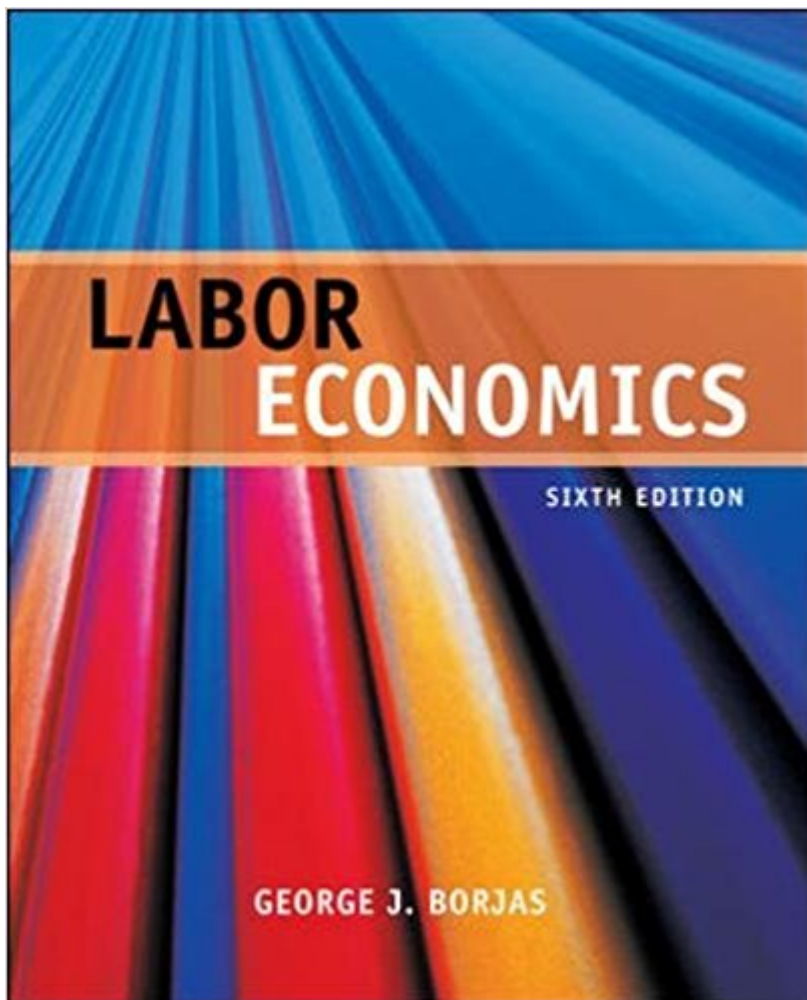

This was a good textbook for labor economics, very accessible. It describes the theory in good detail then goes on to give examples of what happens in the real world. If I wasn't buying for class, I would still have bought an earlier edition.

If you like looking at graphs and intuitive explanations/solutions, then this is your book. If you like analytical econ (actually maximizing with respect to preferences and possibilities), then this is not your book. This made a nice complement to the technical material covered in lectures, but I wouldn't have learned much of anything from this book on its own. Also, slow shipping (but that's what I paid for), and moderate quality for a used book. Could have been worse, but could have been better.
