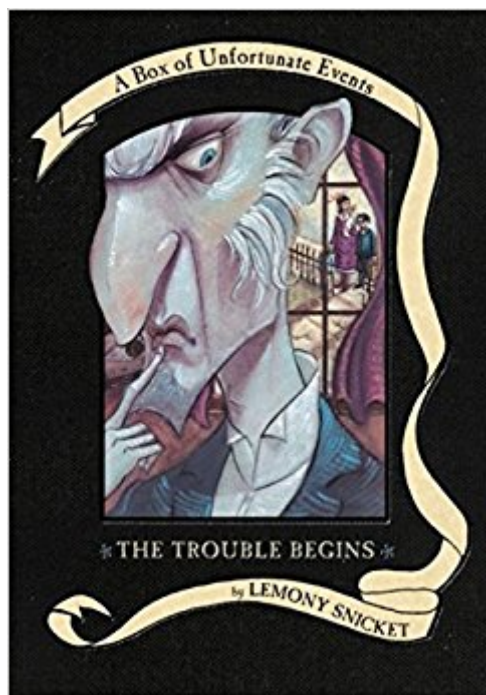




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The Trouble Begins: A Box Of Unfortunate Events, Books 1-3 (The Bad Beginning; The Reptile Room; The Wide Window)
